
DRESSING

THE CAR TEXTILES THAT MOVE WITH YOU



Textile Museum and Documentation Centre 14 June to 20 December 2015







The **Textile Museum and Documentation Centre** presents a new exhibition that explains the importance of and the technology behind textile components in the car manufacturing industry, looking at ongoing research in the field and some of the leading companies involved.

The automotive sector is one of the most dynamic areas of industry in Spain; in Catalonia alone it accounts for 8.3% of industrial employment and generates an annual turnover in excess of 11.8 billion euros. The various parts required to manufacture a car account for more than 75% of the total value of each vehicle; in 2014, parts manufacturers in Spain produced a turnover of more than 29.7 billion euros. Though we may not realise it, textiles play a crucial role in this sector.

DRESSING THE CAR has been organized in the framework of the **European Industrial and Technical Heritage Year 2015** and is supported by the Universitat Politècnica de Catalunya and by companies in the automotive sector, which have created and provided all of the exhibits.

The exhibition space – at the entrance to which is the cut-open chassis of a SEAT LEÓN, in the CDMT foyer – is divided into four thematic areas:

- What we see (the 'clothes'), which presents the visible textile elements that create the interior aesthetics of a car: seats, mats, door panelling, sunshades, boot linings, etc...
- What we don't see (the 'underwear' and 'footwear'), where we find the internal parts, each with its distinct function: insulators and soundproofing materials, airbags, seatbelts, cable coatings, tyres...
- *Fibres and structures*, presenting materials and properties, and the increasingly complex requirements they must satisfy: unwoven fabrics, knitted fabrics, knotted stitch, cable stitch...
- The car of the future: light, recyclable and intelligent, which examines new materials and new properties, including samples from current research and innovation projects



Alongside the exhibition, the CDMT will also hold an accompanying technical seminar and a range of fun and informative activities with the support of students from the UPC.
